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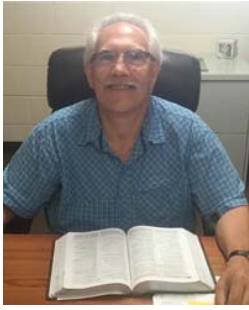
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## What Does 2019 Look Like As You Start?



(... and where did 2018 go?)

I'm not one for making a big deal about resolutions. They're easy to make; they're even easier to forget. But we ALL know some things we need to do differently, don't we?

A friend once told me: "If you aim at nothing, you'll hit it every time." I don't want my life to be about "aiming at nothing."

So I do believe you have to make a good target for areas that you need to work on in your life. Areas could include: finances, health, fitness, education, spiritual growth, ... the list could go on. So, as we close the book on 2018, and turn the page to 2019, what is it that you know you need to do? to change? to start? to complete? to repair?

May I help you get started?

**PRAYER:** I will always be praying for at least (a) one non-believer, (b) one wayward believer, and (c) one faithful believer. Pray with intentionality this year.

**SPIRITUAL GROWTH:** Establish a plan to spend time with God each day. Do whatever it takes to walk more closely with God.

**RELATIONSHIPS:** Most of us have room for improvement in how we relate to others. Perhaps you need to pray more regularly with your family. You might need to reconcile with someone.

**FINANCES:** Saving money requires a plan. Set goals, start working your plan, and spend wisely. If you do, you'll have more to give to God's work.

**CAREER:** Whatever your profession is, you likely want to improve in some area. Do all that you do for the glory of God (1 Corinthians 10:31).

**EDUCATION:** Even if you have earned a terminal degree in your discipline, there's always more to know. Set some reading goals. Take another class.

Keep learning. Set a goal to read at least 1 book a month.

**HEALTH:** God has given us one body that He expects us to take care of. Simply walking more each day is a start.

**CHURCH:** If you're not already involved in a local church, you can start now. If you're already committed to a congregation, don't let yourself grow stagnant – set some new goals for service in that church. Serve in a new area. Stretch yourself. Get out of that comfort zone.

**EVANGELISM:** Few of us are natural evangelists. Set a goal to share the gospel with somebody at least once a month, once a week, etc.

**MISSIONS:** Give to our A-B-C Challenge, which is a monthly contribution that goes toward our Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions. This might be the year you actually get involved in going, in serving, in doing missions.

**DISCIPLESHIP:** Make a commitment to grow spiritually this year. And while you're doing that, make a plan to pour yourself into someone else.
